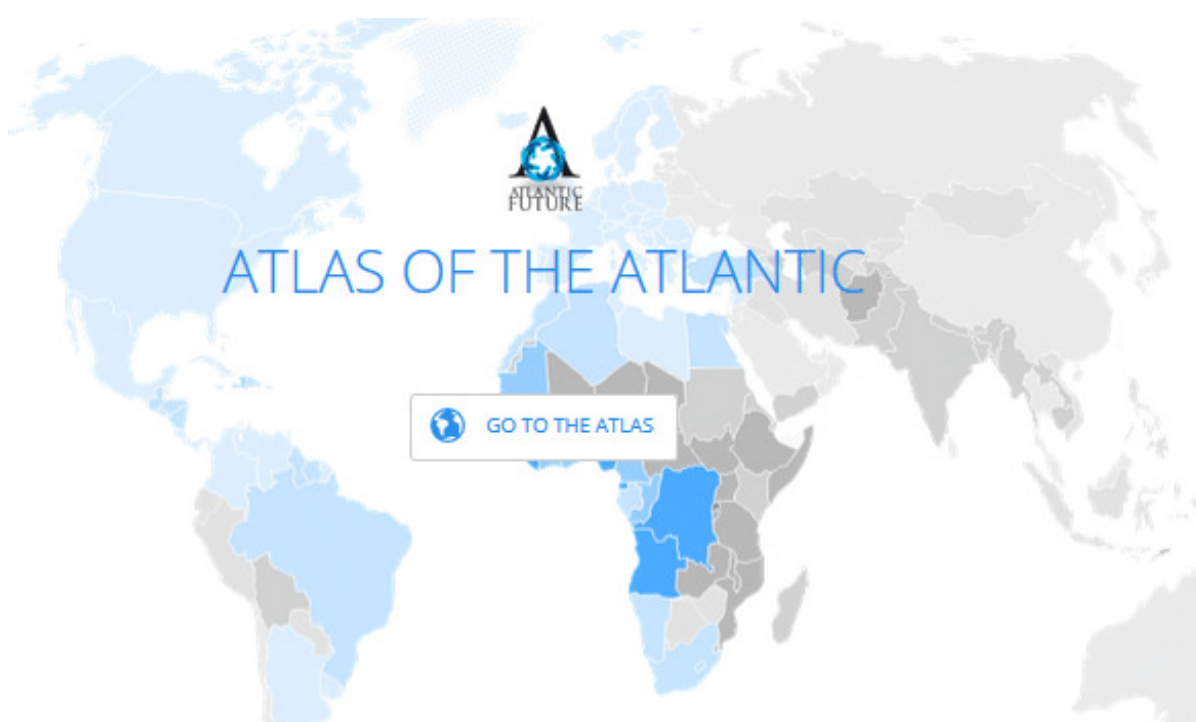

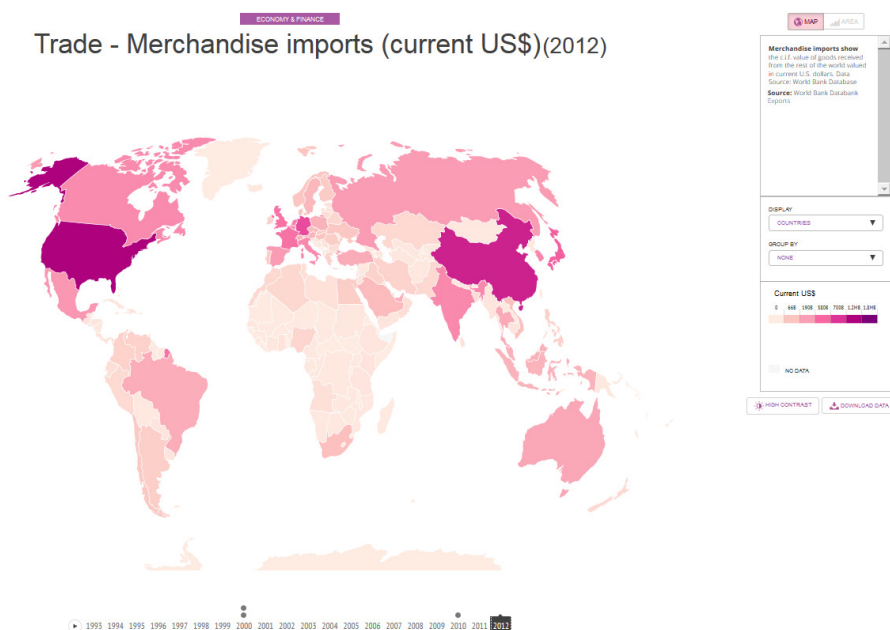

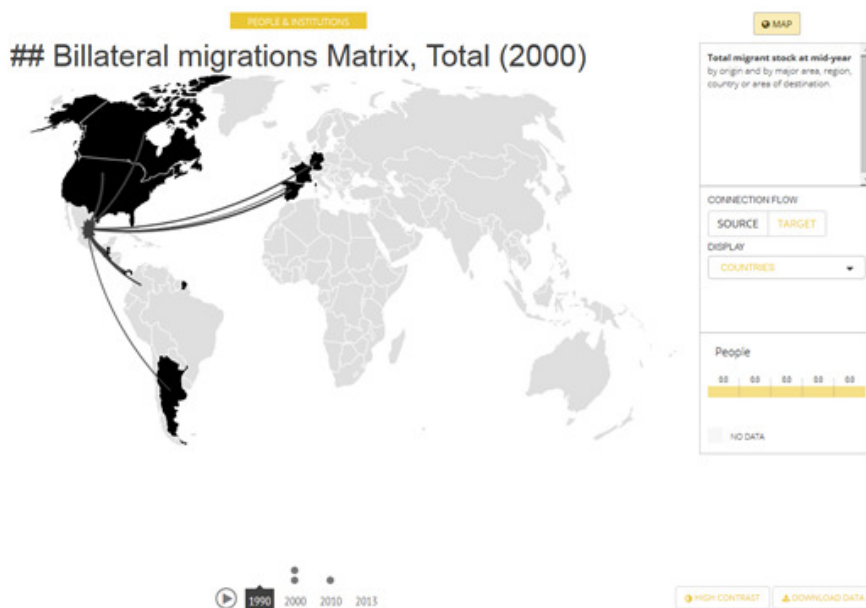


MAPPING TRENDS & FLOWS

Navigate our exploratory tool to access the main indicators and by clicking on the play button, see them mapped and evolving for a two decades period. You will be able to aggregate them regionally, to narrow your focus on the Atlantic Space.

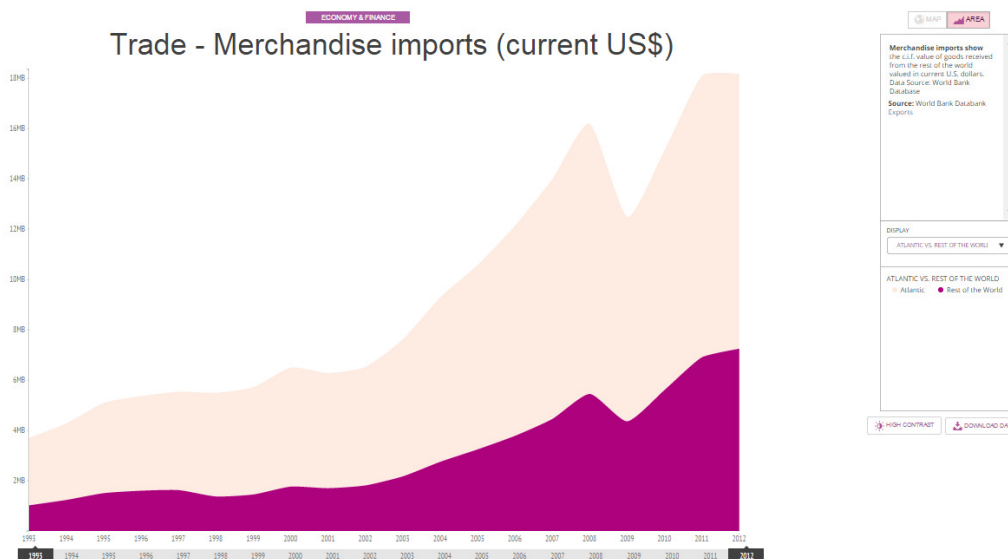


The tool can display flows in motion from/to one selected country and its main partners. Currently this is possible for a limited group of the datasets, labelled as “Matrix”.

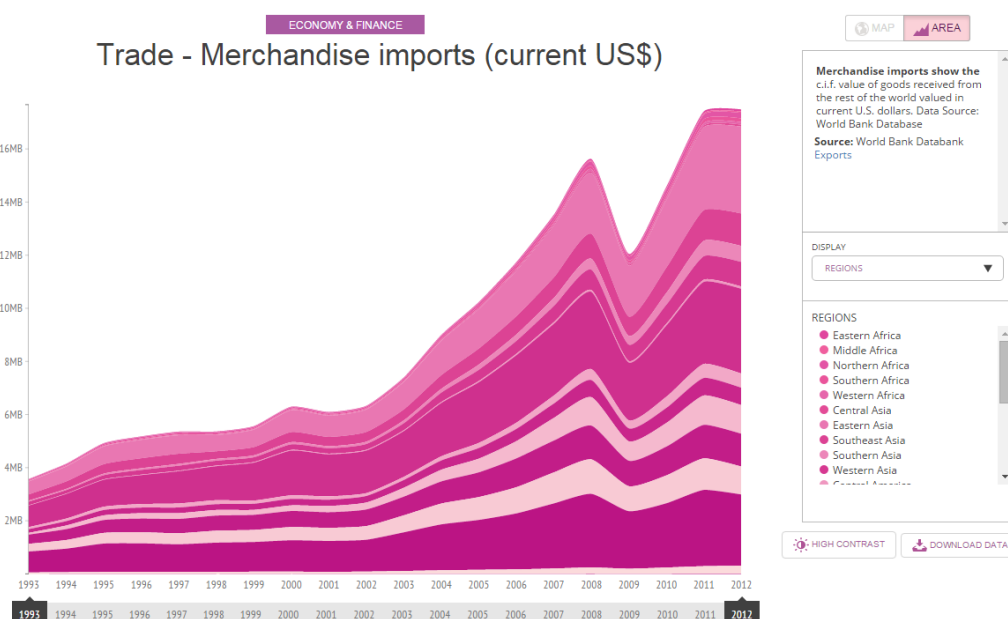


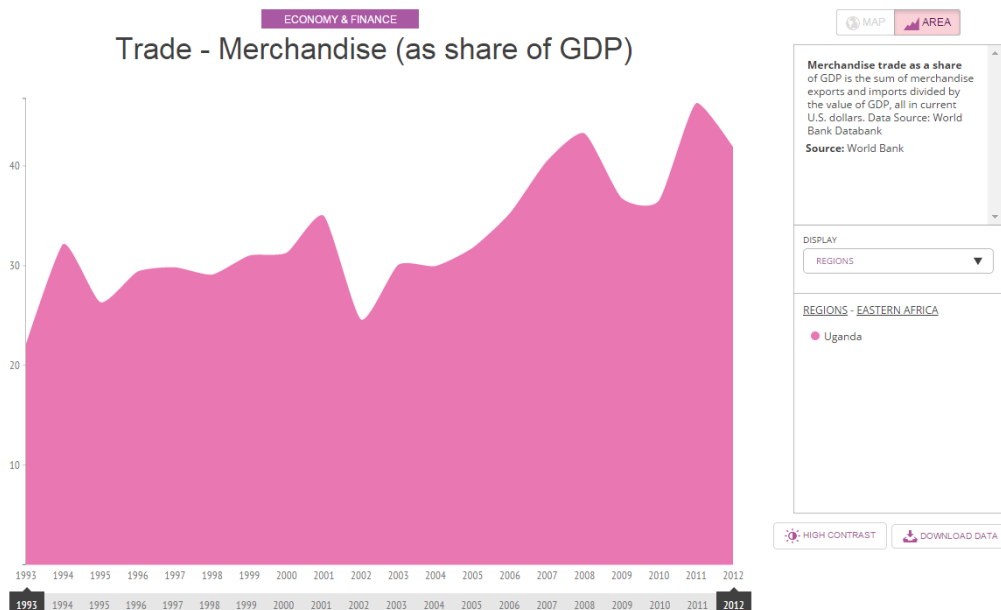
AREA CHART

The button “Area” displays the same indicator in an Area Chart that allows the user to compare trends of the Atlantic Space versus the rest of the World, and the North Atlantic versus the South.



The user can also focus on the different regions and countries by clicking on them (e.g. expand Eastern Africa, and then Uganda)






Is that all?
